Especially with the War on Terrorism underway, security requirements restricting use of RF (radio frequency) in the FORSCOM building south of Atlanta challenged SVN to deliver multiple television channels, such as CNN and major networks to the building via existing resources.

Delivering true video on demand via existing infrastructure, SVN (Safari Video Network) users in business environments can attend a meeting, have an intimate conversation, or update their corporate educational requirements without leaving the demands of their offices.

The fiber optic system within the building, installed over a decade ago, had become obsolete, says Alcorn. Delivering the signal up to the threshold via fiber optics was one step, and providing the signal throughout the campus via existing telephone lines, or 'twisted pair,' was the next. "It saved us money- we didn't have to re-wire the building" says Alcorn. Telephone usage is unaffected.
